

Types of Liquor Licence

Undernoted are a list of the various types of licence that you may apply for and a brief description of each.

Public House allows the sale of alcohol for consumption on or off the premises.

Off Sale allows the sale of alcohol for consumption off the premises. It is an offence to consume alcohol on these premises.

Hotel in towns and cities a hotel must contain at least 4 bedrooms and in rural areas at least 2 bedrooms. Alcohol can be sold for consumption both on and off the premises.

Restricted Hotel a hotel which does not contain a bar counter and is structurally adapted and used for the main midday and evening meals for residents and other persons in which alcohol can be sold or supplied to:

- persons taking table meals as an ancillary to the meal;
- to residents or private friends of the residents, only if the resident pays.

Restaurant premises which are used for the supply of the main midday and evening meals and which do not contain a bar counter. Alcohol can be sold or supplied to persons taking such meals only as ancillary to the meal.

Refreshment this allows the sale of alcohol only for consumption on the premises when food and non-alcoholic beverages are also available and there is no bar counter.

Entertainment for places of public entertainment where consumption of alcohol is ancillary to the entertainment provided. The type of entertainment to be supplied must be defined and conditions to this effect can be included on the licence
