



## REVIEW OF POLLING DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES

In accordance with Sections 18A to E and Section 31 of the Representation of the People Act 1983 (the Act), as amended by the Electoral Administration Act, 2006, notice is hereby given that Renfrewshire Council has now undertaken a review of polling districts and polling places for the Parliamentary constituencies of Paisley and Renfrewshire North, and Paisley and Renfrewshire South. The constituency boundaries themselves were not covered by this review, only the polling district boundaries and polling places which lie within the constituencies.

In accordance with Section 18D(1) of the Act, previous respondents to the consultation or no fewer than thirty registered electors in either constituency may make further representations in writing to the Electoral Commission.

Such representations may only be made on the grounds that the local authority has failed to meet the reasonable requirements of the electors in the constituency, or has failed to take sufficient account of accessibility to disabled persons of the polling stations within a polling place.
