


Aims of the Educational Psychology Service


The central aim is to help children and young people of all ages achieve their potential, particularly to help them overcome any difficulties. The service aims to achieve this through working collaboratively with teachers, parents, young people and others.



The Collaborative Framework

The Educational Psychology Service operates a collaborative approach to service delivery. This approach is characterised by sharing of information, collaborative working and joint approaches to assessment and intervention. Within this framework, a range of service is provided to schools:

- consultation and advice;
- assessment and intervention;
- training and staff development;
- research projects;
- advice on policy or resource development.



Access to the Educational Psychology Service

Every school has a named educational psychologist (EP) who visits the school on a regular basis.

Service input is negotiated each year with key members of school staff. It is usually during these discussions that specific requests for staff development input or research are made.

Consultation and advice to school staff is the first line of service delivery and involves the EP as part of the school's team approach to pupils who experience difficulties. Discussions may involve general matters (eg whole school approaches to learning difficulties) or specific problems, about which a particular course of action can be agreed.

Where concerns about an individual child or young person require further discussion, a formal request for the involvement of the educational psychology service can be made. The resulting collaborative meeting is arranged by the school in consultation with the EP and involves parents, relevant school staff and the pupil (where appropriate). The meeting gathers together existing information, seeks solutions and then plans any necessary future action. A note of the key points is made and circulated. Further meetings can be arranged as necessary to review progress.
