Welcome to Learning Opportunities in Renfrewshire

Who we are:

Adult Learning & Literacies Service (ALLS) is Renfrewshire Council's adult and family learning team. As part of Communities, Housing and Planning Service, the Community Learning Officers, Community Work Assistants and trained volunteers deliver accredited and non-accredited learning opportunities to families and adults aged 16 years+ throughout Renfrewshire.

The learning and teaching is learner-centred, lifelong – accessible at all stages of a person's life, and lifewide, thereby encompassing personal, family and work aspects of living (Scotland's Adult Learning Statement of Ambition, 2014).

Some of the barriers adults may experience in returning to learning are removed through free learning and access to a free crèche, provided by ALLS and supported by qualified and experienced childcare workers.

ALLS promotes adult and family learning in community based settings and delivers the learning programmes from core Learning Centres within the local community, partner venues and schools.

Service Aim:

ALLS support adult returners to develop the tools and skills to improve and enrich their lives by making positive changes, and take control of the decisions that affect them on a daily basis in every area of their lives; family, personal, work and learning.

The holistic approach of the Social Practices model of learning and teaching is adopted in all learning programmes to ensure that the learning is relevant. A collaborative approach between learner, ALLS and partner agencies also helps to ensure that the learner is at the centre of the learning.

Description of Learning

Adult and Youth Literacies

The literacies sessions are for anyone aged 16+ years who wants to improve their reading, writing, spelling and numbers for everyday life, work or learning.

A wide range of support is available and delivered at the learner's pace within a group setting. Examples of learning include, helping your child with homework, calculating change/interest rates on purchases, measuring for home improvements, or any other daily literacy activities. Specific literacies support is also available to gain employment/progression within existing job, or if you are considering going into Further Education. Examples of learning include Intravenous Medicine (I.V.) Administration Calculations test for nurses, Driving Theory, Construction Skills Certificate Scheme (CSCS), Door Supervision (SIA), and entrance exams into careers such as Armed Forces and Police.

Computing for Beginners

This course is aimed at learners with little or no computing skills. Learners will gain skills to navigate the internet, write and respond to emails and use Microsoft Word 2007.

Culture & Conversation Group

The group is for English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) learners of mixed levels who would like a greater understanding of their local surroundings as well as the society and culture in which they live. Learners shall become more fluent in using English for oral communication. Local and global themes and issues are explored in a multicultural group which offers lots of opportunities to practise conversational English.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

ESOL courses help learners to develop their English language skills and support learners to communicate effectively in their everyday lives. This includes helping children with their homework, doctor's appointments, attending college and applying for a job. English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) Parents

This English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) course is suitable for parents and explores themes around communication needed for schooling, homework and accessing health services.

Gaelic Classes (Clasaichean Gàidhlig)

Scottish Gaelic is a unique part of Scotland's national heritage and is a language which is very much alive in Scotland today. The Gaelic language courses are at beginners, intermediate and progression levels. They are aimed at adults who are interested in learning to speak the language, and learn more about the culture. Carson nach feuch sibh i?! Why don't you come and try it!

IT Skills for Life

This course is aimed at learners who have some computer skills and would like to build their knowledge and confidence by focusing on using online resources. The content includes sourcing information, communication and performing everyday computing activities for family, work and learning.

IT Skills for Work

This course is aimed at learners who have some computer skills and would like to build their confidence in using office and work based computing packages. The course will help develop familiarity with data handling, communication and data analysis functions and techniques.

Men's Personal & Social Development (PSD)

This group provides a space for men of all ages to participate in activities and discussion. A varied programme of topics and activities are provided which are directed by the interests of those attending, covering a wide range of subjects, from health and wellbeing to history. The informal drop-in nature of the group makes every week interesting and there's always something new to learn.

Parenting

This course is for any parent or carer, who would like to improve communication with their child or teenager and build mutual respect, self esteem and confidence.

Psychology Taster

This tutor lead course guides students through 2 free online course units offered by the Open University: Starting with Psychology & Psychology in the 21st Century. Free registration with the Open University is required to receive

certification from the Open University on completion of each online unit.

Speakeasy

A course designed to develop parents' confidence in being able to support their children's learning in relation to sexual health and relationships.

SQA Core Skills I.C.T SCQF level 4

This SQA accredited unit is about using straightforward information, communication and technology (ICT) effectively to access, process and present information

in familiar, everyday settings. Learners should be confident using ICT and may already have achieved ICT at SCQF level 3 or similar.

Steps to Excellence (STEPS)

An internationally recognised course aimed at improving and enriching people's lives. It offers learners the opportunity to take a fresh look at their current way of life; enables them to see how much they are truly capable of achieving and offers them the tools to make positive change.

Work Club

The work club provides access to computers and internet for job search. Staff can provide support with updating and uploading C.V.'s; registering and updating Find a Job; emails and application forms.

10 Lessons for Life

This is a course that helps learners to begin the process of self reflection, helps learners to acknowledge their skills and strengths, and supports learners to take the first steps back into learning. It is a safe, supportive and encouraging environment that enables learners to embark on a new and exciting learning journey.

Crèche

This is a unique service open to all residents in Renfrewshire. Adult Learning & Literacies Services offer a free crèche service to learners participating in their community-based adult learning classes and groups. This service is supported by qualified and experienced childcare workers who are registered practitioners with SSSC, and inspected by the Care Inspectorate. We welcome all partnership agencies crèche enquiries.
