How We'll Do It

Prevention

We will ensure our staff are equipped to identify and respond to GBV and our community have an understanding of GBV and the supports available to them.

Participation

We will ask our service users about their experiences of services and ensure their voices are heard in the development of new services and supports.

Protection

We will provide a multi-agency response to safety plan for our most high risk victims of GBV and will target our serious and serial perpetrators of abuse.

Provision

We will provide high quality, responsive services to victims and perpetrators of GBV.
