### Statement of Income and Expenditure 2020-2021

#### 1. Summary

1.1. The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's approval of the draft Statement of Income and Expenditure (hereinafter "Statement") attached at Appendix 1 for publication. The requirement to publish an annual Statement was introduced in 2017.

### 2. Background

- 2.1 Section 9B of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 ("the Act") requires that the Licensing Board, on an annual basis, publish an annual report detailing the Licensing Board's relevant income and expenditure in the previous financial year. "Relevant income" currently includes income received in connection with the Board's liquor licensing function and "relevant expenditure" includes expenditure incurred by the Board, the Council and the Licensing Standards Officers. The Statement also requires to contain an explanation of how the amounts set out in it have been calculated.
- 2.2 The annual Statement setting out the Board's income and expenditure for the financial year to 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021 requires to be published by 30<sup>th</sup> June this year, except, in terms of emergency changes to the above legislation, where this deadline cannot be met for a reason relating to coronavirus.
- 2.3 The Board's approval of the Statement at Appendix 1 is now sought to enable the above requirement to be met.
- 2.4 In the report considered by the Board on 30<sup>th</sup> November 2020 which sought approval of the annual financial statement for the period 2019-2020, officers asked the Board to note that, while they would consider means in the future by which costs might be reduced to address the deficit reported in previous years, the Annual Functions Report for the period 2020-2021 would cover the period affected by the coronavirus pandemic. The Board may wish to note in this regard that income from liquor licensing in 2020-2021 reduced significantly from that received in the previous financial year (£209,170) due to a reduction in annual fee income and applications received, particularly during periods when greater restrictions were in place. However, this reduction in income was offset to some extent by temporary reductions in staffing and the remaining staff requiring to assist in other areas of licensing according to increased demand in those areas.

# 3. Recommendations

It is recommended that the Board -

3.1 Agree publication of the report attached at Appendix 1.
