The staff that work here will help you with life skills if you need it. This is a greast place to stay, you will enjoy your independence but support is there if you need it (AM, 19yrs)

16 Charleston Square is made up of 10 flats over 2 levels all with their own front door. You enter the building through a controlled entry reception area then walk straight through into the huge shared garden. From here you can see all the flats, which have a kitchen, 1 bedroom, bathroom (with a bath) and lounge.



We want you to enjoy the perks of having your own flat and a big part of this is having visitors. All we ask is that you;

- Sign them in at the main door
- Ensure they are respectful to others and the environment ie. *Keep noise/mess to an acceptable standard.*
- Don't have visitors past midnight (*overnight guests can be agreed through prior discussion*).





Although we appreciate that your flat is 'your' flat, part of the conditions of living at Charleston Square are that we gain access to your flat to ensure all health and safety regulations are being followed and that you are keeping your flat to an acceptable standard. If we feel you need more support around this then we can agree to give you more support to create healthy routines. A full Health & Safety inspection is also carried out every calendar month by a member of the Management Team. Prior to this inspection you will be issued with a letter to advise you that access is required.

Due to Health & Safety and Fire Regulations the following items are not permitted in your flat:

- Deep fat fryers
- Damaged electrical items
- Plug in heaters (unless supplied by the Renfrewshire Council)



Prior to you moving into Charleston Square you will be allocated a Key Team which will consist of; case manager, keyworker and a co-keyworker. This information sheet aims to explain the keywork system and answer some of the commonly asked questions regarding this.

FAQ'S

What is a keyworkers role?

To oversee your plan and be the main contact for you. All info is shared back to your key worker.

What is a keytime?

Individual time with you to discuss <u>you</u> and aspects of your plan.

Should I wait to see my keyworker if I have a problem?

No. Speak to any of us whenever you want - it's why we're here.

What is a co-keyworker?

Steps in when your keyworker isn't here.

Can I request a change of keyworker?

Of course. You should have a positive relationship with your keyworker to get the best out of it.

We have a full plan of activities held mainly in the hub so there's always something to do. If you have any ideas of theme nights, cooking activities, anything really, then just say and we'll organise it.

We will have a weekly planner on display but for anything last minute, we will send you a text and invite you along.



Note: as we are an outreach service, there may be some young people visiting who don't live here.

Getting to Know the Local Area

The service is situated just off Neilston Road, Paisley. There is a Morrison's/Aldi Store within a 5 minute walk from the service. There is also a library, doctors and dentist all within a 10-minute walk from the service.

The local job centre and careers office is located within a 10minute bus journey or 30-minute walk from the service.

Also, you can find Canal Street Train Station within 5 minutes' walk and Gilmour Street Train Station within 10-15 minutes' walk from CSQ.

CSQ is located close to <u>Brodie Park</u> and local shops cafes, supermarkets and post office.

There is also easy access to <u>Paisley Piazza & Paisley Centre</u> (shopping), <u>University of the West of Scotland</u> (Storrie Street), <u>West College Scotland</u> and <u>Paisley Art Centre</u> (New Street).



We proactively include LGBTQi people in every aspect of our service. We want everyone in our service to be safe, supported and included.

With this in mind, we will ask what pronoun you would like to be used in reference to you, such as **She**/**Her** or **Zie**/**Hir**, which will be used in all future paperwork.

Appendix 1

Complaints Procedure

If you have an issue that you feel can't be resolved through discussion, we have a complaints procedure so this can be logged formally.

The 1st Stage is a Verbal complaint to a staff member. If you are not happy with the outcome then will progress to a written complaint (Stage 2) with a written response from the manager. If you are not satisfied, this will move to a Stage 3 where the Service Manager will respond.

You also have the right to contact the Care Inspectorate at any time;
