Guidelines for the Conduct of Street Collections

- No collection of money and no sale of articles for the benefit of charitable or other purposes can be made or take place in any street or public place within Renfrewshire Council unless the person, organisation or other body responsible for the collection or sale has obtained a permit from Renfrewshire Council authorising them to do so.
- 2. Applications for a permit, giving dates and times for which the application is required, should be made in writing to the Head of Legal Services, North Building, Cotton Street, Paisley not less than 2 months prior to the proposed collection date. However, as regular collectors apply at least 6 months in advance, it would be advisable to apply for a collection date as early as possible. No collection should be made or take place on any date other that the date stated on the permit and Renfrewshire Council may limit such collections to streets, roads or public places which they feel suitable.
- 3. No collection or sale should be made or take place so as to cause any obstruction to the traffic or annoyance of foot passengers.
- 4. No person under the age of 14 years should act as collector or seller and no person between the ages of 14 and 16 years should, without the consent of Renfrewshire Council, act as a collector or seller unless accompanied by an adult.
- 5. The person applying for permission should take steps to ensure that collectors and others concerned are made acquainted with the requirements of these guidelines.
- 6. No person should act as a collector or seller unless he / she has in their possession an authorisation signed by the person to whom the authorisation has been issued. Such collector or seller should, when required by a Police Officer or prospective contributor or purchaser, produce said authorisation for inspection by the above.
- 7. Within one month from the date of each collection or sale, the person, society or committee should forward to the Head of Legal Services, North Building, Cotton Street, Paisley, a statement showing in detail the amount collected and the expenses incurred in connection with the collection or sale; and such person, society or committee should, if required by Renfrewshire Council, satisfy them as to the due and proper application of the free proceeds of the collection or sale.
- 8. Any person who has been exempted from sub-section (1) of Section 119 of this Act by a direction from the Secretary of State under sub-section (11) shall, unless the Secretary of State otherwise directs, give to Renfrewshire Council 3 months notice of his intention to organise a public charitable collection.
