Brown Institute Garden

Introduction

Renfrewshire Council are developing proposals to reimagine the site of former Brown Institute, Renfrew as a new public space and garden. The proposals aim to honour the legacy of the Brown Institute and provide a new civic space for the local community which supports Renfrew town centre as a vibrant and thriving place.

Garden Design

Initial designs for the new space enhance the site with hard and soft landscaping including pedestrian pathways, seating and a mix of native trees, shrubs and seasonal plants. 'Rain garden' features are also proposed to help with natural drainage.

A key element of the design is reuse of key architectural features from the Brown Institute, in order to maintain a connection to the site's history and to preserve Renfrew's cultural heritage.

Proposals include the reuse of red sandstone brick as part of new seating and to create totem features within the site, as well as integration of signage and plaques from the building.




